


Write a story with a river theme. Maybe there is a river monster or a creature which comes to life!

Design 6 Top Trump Cards or a power-point based on rivers of the world.

Make a globe balloon and label the longest river in each continent on it.

Create a textile collage of a river or waterfall.

At a river's estuary people enjoy sailing. Draw and make some symmetrical designs for sailing.

Make a 3D river creature out of a plastic bottle.

Make a 3D model of a river from source to sea.

Create a 'You Choose' board or ppt based on our topic 'Rivers.' You need to research and make notes about the following aspects:

1. Rivers of the UK
2. Rivers Around the World
3. Describe the 3 Sections of a River
4. How are Water Falls Formed?
5. River Pollution (or Flooding)

Record your work via photos. There are 5 possible sections so you might like to choose one each week.

Create a sculpture of a river creature or plant. You could use clay, salt dough, papier mache or any material of your choice.

Make a model of a boat. This might be a sailing dinghy, barge, canoe, tanker or any other boat you might find on a river. Name a river it could be used on.

Create your own video clip for the met office giving a weather warning to a place that is at risk of flooding.
